Law associations to co-host Blue Zone Side Event @ COP27 on 12 November 2022: The law as a key tool to address climate change

The International Bar Association (IBA), the American Bar Association (ABA), the Brazilian Bar Association (OAB) and the Law Society of England and Wales (LSEW) are set to host an official UNFCCC Side Event during the 2022 United Nations Climate Change Conference (COP27) at 4:45pm on 12 November 2022.

The law has a crucial role in tackling climate change. Professional organisations represent thousands of lawyers advising companies & governments who sponsor major projects and set climate policy. Focusing on utilising the law as a key tool toward addressing climate change and promoting equity, the discussion will cover new initiatives that seek to grapple with the climate crisis.
